Presidential Awardee

Land a lawyer who is the 67th and current Mayor of the City of Hartford, CT., since January 1,2016.



He previously served as General Counsel for the Connecticut Governor Dannel Malloy. Before that, he served in two senior posts at the United States department of the Treasury during President Barack Obama's first term – as Senior Advisor to the Deputy secretary of the Treasury and then as deputy Assistant Secretary of the Treasury for Terrorist Financing and Financial crimes.

Bronin has served as an officer in the US Navy Reserve and was deployed to Afghanistan and assigned to the Anti-Corruption Task Force. He also worked in the private sector, at the Hartford Financial Services Group, as Chief of Staff to the president of the Hartford Property and Casualty Division.

In December 2014, the law firm Hinckley Allen & Snyder, LLP announced Bronin would become a partner.

Mayor Bronin is a member of the Democratic Party.

Bronin was born in Westchester County, New York and completed high school at Phillips Exeter Academy in New Hampshire, before he attended Yale University, as an undergraduate.

Upon graduation, he attended the Balliol College, Oxford as a Rhodes scholar. He returned to the United States of America (USA), to earn a J.D. degree at Yale Law school.

After graduation from Yale Law school, Bronin joined the Hartford Insurance Company in the Asylum Hill neighborhood of Hartford, where he worked first as associate counsel and assistant to the general counsel, and then as chief of staff to the President of The Hartford's Property and Casualty Division, Neil Wolin.

He is a partner at the private law firm, Hinckley Allen, LLP

Extremely delighted at his achievements, Jatin Patel said, "2023 is a momentous year for me to be recognized by the Federal government and the CHoF. CHoF Inductee...

Kallidaikuruchi S. Viswanathan

Kallidaikuruchi S Viswanathan is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), of the Chennai Super Kings (CSK), a four-time champion in the Indian Premier League. Fondly called 'Kasi Sir' in the cricket fraternity, he has more than five+ decades of experience in cricket and administration, as he knows the game inside out and is one of the pillars of the franchise's success.

He has held responsibilities in the Tamil Nadu Cricket Association (TNCA), IPL

and the BCCI.

In his early days, he played both junior and senior cricket in Tirunelveli district. In the late 1960s, he was an integral part of the district team that won the SS Rajan Trophy, an inter-district tournament.

He was part of the Jolly Rovers team and has also played for various clubs, including Jai Hind, MRC A, and Prithvi.

After quitting the game in 1986, he ventured into cricket administration. He had been working in the cost department at India Cements. He has been associated with India Cements for almost over four decades. He worked in ICL Rolls up to 31st March, 2015.

In 1989, Mr. N. Srinivasan handpicked KS Viswanathan to revive India Cements cricketing activities and get them back on track. This was the start of his wonderful career in cricket administration!

His Journey with TNCA

2008 – Secretary of the TNCA


His journey with CSK

From 01-Apr-2015, he was with CSK as CEO (Chief Executive Officer).

11-Feb-2016, he moved from CSK to ICL as Consultant.

From 19th January, 2018, he moved from ICL to CSK and was appointed as CEO of CSK.







CHoF Inductee... Wasim Akram

Wasim Akram was born 3 June, 1966 and is a noted Pakistani cricket commentator, coach, and former cricketer and captain of the Pakistan national cricket team. Akram is widely regarded as one of the greatest fast bowlers of all time, and several critics regard him as the greatest left-arm fast bowler in the history of the sport. Former West Indies captain for 14 tests & 16 ODIs, was one of the dreaded players by teams around the world. He was only the second batsman to score a double ton on captaincy debut.



He is often revered as The Sultan of Swing. In October, 2013, Wasim Akram was the only Pakistani cricketer to be named in an all-time Test World XI to mark the 150th anniversary of Wisden Cricketers' Almanack.


A left-arm fast bowler who could bowl with significant pace, he holds the world record for most wickets in List A cricket, with 881, and he is second only to Sri Lankan off-spin bowler Muttiah Muralitharan in terms of ODI wickets, with 502 in total. He is considered to be one of the founders, and perhaps the finest exponent of, reverse swing bowling.

He was the first bowler to reach the 500-wicket mark in ODI cricket, and he did so during the 2003 World Cup. In 2002, Wisden released its only list of best players of all time. Wasim was ranked as the best bowler in ODI of all time, with a rating of 1223.5, ahead of Allan Donald, Imran Khan, Waqar Younis, Joel Garner, Glenn McGrath and Muralitharan. Wasim took 23 four-wicket hauls in 356 ODI matches played. On 30 September, 2009, Akram was one of five new members inducted into the ICC Cricket Hall of Fame. He was the bowling coach of Kolkata Knight Riders. However, he took a break from the position for IPL 6, citing a need to spend more time with family in Karachi, and he took a further break from IPL 2017; he was replaced by Lakshmipathy Balaji.

He was working as director and bowling coach of Islamabad United in Pakistan Super League until he left to join Multan Sultans in August, 2017. In October 2018, he was named in the Pakistan Cricket Board's seven-member advisory cricket committee. In November 2018, he joined PSL franchisee Karachi Kings as president.

The Government of Pakistan awarded him the Hilal-e-Imtiaz on 23 March, 2019, for his lifetime achievements in the field of cricket.







CHoF Inductee... Zaheer Abbas

yed Zaheer Abbas Kirmani, popularly known as Zaheer Abbas, is a former Pakistan Cricket Captain. In 2015, he became president of the International Cricket Council (ICC), the world's governing body for the sport, the first from his country and the third cricketer after the legendary Colin Cowdrey and Clyde Walcott, to hold the highest rank post in world cricket.

Sometimes known as 'the Asian Bradman', Zaheer Abbas is regarded as one of the finest batsmen in the history of the sport, becoming the first batter to score three consecutive centuries in one-day internationals.



Between October, 1969 and October, 1985, a span of 16 years, Abbas had totaled 42,477 runs (5,062 Test; 2,572 ODI & 34,843 first class), with 127 centuries (108 First class, 12 Test and 7 ODI) & 328 catches (34 Test, 16 ODI & 278 first Class).


There was not a touch of arrogance about Zaheer's batting but of lyrical, fluent movement. His strength was precision and timing. He had the ability to go on back and front foot with equal facility, on occasions moving from backward to forward or vice versa during the course of one stroke and yet send the ball crashing to the fence. When the going was good, he seemed like a maestro at work, his artistry, his elegance leaving connoisseurs awestruck.

Zaheer's first big score came in England, a double hundred, 274 to be precise, at Edgbaston in only his second Test. With that innings, not only did he prove the pundits wrong, who thought that his technique and high back lift would make him highly suspect against the seaming ball, it also heralded the arrival of a new international star. Such was his mastery, so profound his concentration that he never seemed like getting out.

Many English counties lined up to recruit this lean and bespectacled youth, but he opted for Gloucestershire, playing right to the end, making runs year on, year in, a huge pile, well in excess of 1,000 almost every season, 2,544 in one glorious Indian summer of 1976 and another 2,305 in 1981.

Having already scored another double hundred (240) in the Oval Test in 1974, and some big scores on the Australian tour of 1976-77 including 101 at Adelaide, he was signed up by the Kerry Packer circus, which resulted in his missing two rubbers against England. When the Packer bunch was welcomed back to the fold for the Indian series, the first between the two in 18 years, Zaheer was at his majestic best, putting to sword the feared Indian spin quartet to notch scores of 176, 96 and 235 in successive innings. His tally of 583 runs in a short rubber was then a world record.

The only Asian to have made a century of centuries in first class cricket to date, he really had a 'Bradmanesque' appetite for runs. Nothing reflects this better than his making a century in each innings on eight occasions in a first-class match, a world record. All the more amazing is the fact that in four out of these eight, he made a double hundred and a hundred. His 100th hundred, predictably, a double hundred (215) against India in the 1982-83, Lahore Test, was followed by two more Test hundreds in that series. Such was his mastery of the sport.







CHoF Inductee... Mushtaq Ahmed Malik

Mushtaq Ahmed Malik, born 28 June 1970, is a Pakistani cricket coach and former cricketer who currently acts as the spin bowling coach for the Pakistan Cricket Team.

At his peak Mushtaq was described as being one of the best wrist-spinners in the world. His international career spanned from 1990 until 2003 as he claimed 185 wickets in Test crick-

et and 161 in One Day Internationals. He was at his most prolific internationally between 1995 and 1998, and his most successful years as a domestic player were for Sussex in the early 2000s.

During his time with Sussex, he was the leading wicket-taker in the County Championship for five successive seasons, and helped the county win the competition in 2003, 2006 and 2007.

Mushtaq Ahmed made his first-class cricket debut in January 1987, at the age of 16. Shortly thereafter, he competed in the 1988 Under-19 World Cup, where he was the joint leading wicket-taker, claiming 19 wickets at an average of 16.21. Pakistan reached the final of the tournament, which they lost to Australia by five wickets.

Mushtaq made his full international debut on 23 March 1989, playing a One Day International (ODI) against Sri Lanka.

He retained his place in the Pakistan side for the subsequent tri-series with India and the West Indies, and made his Test cricket debut in January 1990 against Australia at the Adelaide Oval.

In 1992, Mushtaq was part of the Pakistan team which won the Cricket World Cup and played a key role in Pakistan winning the World Cup tournament.

He was joint-second amongst bowlers by wickets taken, having claimed 16 during the tournament, trailing only his compatriot Wasim Akram.


Between November 1995 and March 1998, he took at least ten wickets in every Test series, and claimed ten five-wicket hauls.

During his most prolific years of Test cricket, Mushtaq played his first spell of county cricket, appearing for Somerset between 1993 and 1998.

He returned to Sussex in 2003 and became a mainstay of the team for six successive years.

In his book Somerset County Cricket Club (100 Greats), Eddie Lawrence describes Mushtaq as "one of Somerset's best-ever "overseas" signings."

In 1997, he was named as one of the five Wisden Cricketers of the Year, in which he was described as being a member of "a glittering triumvirate of wrist-spinners who adorn the modern game."



CHoF Inductee... Robin Singh



Mr. Robin Singh is currently the director and head coach of the national senior team of the United Arab Emirates (UAE), an Associate Member of the International Cricket Council (ICC), the world governing body of the sport. Additionally, he is the General Manager of the MI Emirates in ILT20 League in UAE.

Robin played for Trinidad & Tobago and was named captained of the Trinidad & Tobago Under-19 team. He later moved to India to study and holds a Master's degree in Economics.

Robin Singh's boasts an impressive professional playing resume. He represented Ranji Trophy for Tamil Nadu from 1986 to 2002, including captaining the State team from 1995 to 2002, and leading the South Zone team as well.

He made his Test debut for India in 1989, in Trinidad and returned with the team (India) in 1996, before call it quits in 2002. During that time, he developed a love for the shorter version of the game, the One Day International (ODI), playing in a career high 136 matches. He played one Test match for India.

To his credit, he has coached at the highest level of the sport for multiple countries.

Philosophy...

On coaching, Singh believes that every player brings something unique to the team which gives both himself and the player(s) an opportunity to learn and evolve with the game.

"My job is to create an inclusive environment that fosters pride for the nation through cricket excellence and hard work; built on cutting-edge methods to focus on long-term athlete development and drive a winning mindset."









CHoF Inductee... George Washington Stein

George Washington Steir was born and raised in Saint Ann, Jamaica in June 27, 1957. He moved to the Greater Hartford area in 1977, currently living in Bloomfield, CT. He has been married for 43 years to wife, Diane, and they have three (3) children (Litisha, Noelle and Khaleel). He is a Certified Volunteer Fire Fighter in Bloomfield for over ten (10) years.

George is a graduate of Dinthill Technical High School in Jamaica (Class of 1975), Hartford State Technical College (Associate's from 1982-1986) and Central Connecticut State University (Bachelor's from 1988-2000).

George started his professional career as a Chemical Technician at Har-Conn Chrome Company, and later became a supervisor. After 15 years, he moved to Kamatics Corporation (a Division of Kaman Corporation) and recently retired in 2021, after 27 years of service. George is also a National Certified Hazardous Material Manager (CHMM).

George is an avid sports person, and first became involved with Club Cricket in the Hartford area in 1986. He was an original member at the formation of the Caribbean Tourers Organization in Hartford, where he served as the Sports Coordinator. He was also a long-time member the Sportmen's Athletic Club, where he held roles of Sports Coordinator, Treasurer and was Captain of their Cricket Team for eight (8) years.


At the League level, in addition to playing for his Club Team, he held Administrative Roles in the Connecticut Cricket League, serving as Treasurer and President. He was also responsible for preparing IRS Tax documents for the League's Non-Profit Certification. Based on his active Community and Cricket involvement, and his knowledge of Cricket, George was selected to serve on the Boards of Friends of Keney Park (FOKP), and also the Hartford Police Athletic League (Har PAL). He was the Director of Youth Cricket with Har PAL.

George's work regarding the development of Cricket in the Greater Hartford area includes:

- Current City Permit Holder for Keney Park Cricket Fields
- Worked with the City of Hartford Department of Public Works and the Mayor's Office to ensure the Keney Park Cricket Fields are maintained. In 2012, he worked with the City to upgrade those Cricket Fields.
- In the early 2000's, George worked with the Town of Bloomfield to initially build a temporary Cricket Field next to the Board of Education Building. Several years later, he worked with the City to build the permanent Cricket Field at the Laurel Elementary School. For many years, George was responsible for securing and being the Holder of the City Permit for the Bloomfield Cricket Fields.
- George coordinated with the West Indian Foundation of Hartford, and the Cricket Hall of Fame, to develop Summer Youth Programs in Keney Park and at Martin Luther King, Jr., Middle School.
- In 2015 & 2022, he coordinated with the Founder and Director of New England Youth Cricket Academy to plan the USA Northeast National Youth Tournament at Keney Park Cricket Fields. The Tournament involved more than 120 boys and girls of all ages.

In addition to his work on development of Cricket in the Greater Hartford Area, George, his wife Diane and their daughter Noelle support the following Groups and Organizations:

- Portland (Jamaica) Women's Cricket Provides funding and equipment for annual tournaments
- Atlanta (Georgia) Women's Cricket Provides funding for food and equipment for the annual Tournament.
- Dave Cameron Cricket Tournament Provide funding for tournament to aid in the growth of cricket in the community.
- Cricket Hall of Fame Annual "Six A Side" Cricket Tournament Provide team funding for the tournament



CHoF Inductee...

Peter John Nero

Peter John Nero's induction into the Cricket Hall of Fame (CHoF), could not have come at a more opportune time, a time when the sport is scouring the boundaries and beyond for commitment and determination from players and administrators, alike. Nero, a Trinidad & Tobago native and former Warrant Officer in the National Defense Force (TNTDF), last officiated in a cricket match of note some 5 years ago, 2 decades after making his maiden appearance as an umpire (where).

A dedicated fan of the sports of gentlemen and a disciplined administrator, PJN is of the view that information/knowledge not shared is nothing. With that mindset he has taken it upon himself to impart his knowledge of the fundamentals of the sport to those who will lend an ear.

Using his vast experience as an umpire and administrator of the sport at the local, regional, national and international levels, can be credited with injecting a new approach to how players approach the sport.

His workshop sessions with players and aspiring administrators have garnered worldwide recognition as recent as the staging of the ICC Women's U19 Word Cup competition, hosted by South Africa.

With some 213 matches under his broad-rimmed hat, standing at one end of the wicket, and weighing the current state of the game, if not globally, then certainly regionally, PJN has vowed to be a 'change agent', setting up his own training program with the blessings of Cricket West Indies (CWI), the regional governing body of the sport.

He is a certified coach and trainer with accreditations from Deakin University, Universities of Leeds and Glasgow and the International Cricket Council (ICC), the governing body for the sport, worldwide, and has conducted sessions for/on behalf of CWI, Caribbean Professional League (CPL), the Americas and ICC.

As chairman of the West Indies Cricket Umpires Association (WICUA) Training and Examination Committee, 'PJN' has oversight responsibility for some 105 umpires/administrators across all states including New York, Atlanta and Florida.

A special mention must be made that since October 2017, PJN has been coordinating the training, coaching and development of the female program at the international, senior and junior levels.





He was elected **President** of the **West Indian Independence Celebration Committee of Hartford** in the year 2000, serving with distinction for (3) years.





A ileen Inniss is a trailblazer and she continues to dream big, that one day soon, she will be standing in the middle of a Test match, officiating and adjudicating as players and fans alike, enjoy the competition between bat and ball.

That's the kind of passion that has fueled her participation in a sport dominated by men. After all, the mention of 'Cricket, as the Sport of Gentlemen, is not without merit.

That said, Aileen is on a mission to be the best that she can be, all things considered. Getting this far, has been quite a journey, a journey that started in her native Guyana, many moons ago, reached a high pint in 1998, and encapsulate here for your benefit.







CHoF Golden Achievement Awardee.. STATEN ISLAND CRICKET CLUB, Est. 1866

History...

The club originally played at St. George on the "Flats" or old Camp Washington Terminal from 1866 to 1886. While not the oldest cricket club in the United States, it does claim to be the oldest cricket club in continuous use since its founding in that country.

Mary Outerbridge brought tennis to the club in 1874. The first national tennis tournament in America was held at the club on September 1, 1880. 'The waterfront land was known by its Civil War use as Camp Washington. It was here that Mary Ewing Outerbridge, resident of the historic area, introduced lawn tennis in the spring of 1874.

Her brother Emilius helped her to set up a net and mark out a tennis court on the grounds of Camp Washington used by the Staten Island Cricket and Baseball Club. The club had to give way to Erastus Wiman's ventures at that site and move to the former Rufus King Delafield estate in the Livingston neighborhood of Staten Island about 1.8 miles (2.9 km) away from St. George.

In 1906, the name of the club was changed to the **Staten Island Cricket and Tennis Club**, and changed again in 1931, to the Staten Island Cricket Club. In 1925, the property was sold to the Staten Island Academy then sold in 1930, to the city of New York.

After the sale to the city, the estate was originally named Livingston Park but was later renamed Walker Park in memory of Randolph St. George Walker, Jr., a casualty of World War I and son of a prominent member and officer of the club. A clubhouse on the grounds burned down in 1932, taking many of the club's records with it. The clubhouse was replaced with a Tudor style brick structure in 1934, that is still standing.

Famous cricketers that have played while visiting at the SICC include England captain Pelham Warner played who there in 1903, Gilbert Jessop, Donald Bradman, Everton Weekes, and Garry Sobers. Uncorroborated club lore has it that W. G. Grace, Colin Blythe, and K. S. Ranjitsinhji also played at Walker (Livingston) Park.

Early movie scenes of the S. I. Cricket Club can be seen in the famous silent film *Raffles the Amateur Cracksman* (1917), with famous actor John Barrymore. Barrymore lived on Staten Island as a child. The film is also on YouTube. Scenes show a cricket match played at the club.





She was the recipient of several accolades to include the Cricketer of the Year in 1988, 1990, 1991, 1993 and 1997, culminating in the prestigious title of Sport Woman of the Year in 1997. Perhaps best known for her admirable execution of the square cut, her highest individual score was 99 not out, at the Domestic level and 88 not out, against Jamaica at the Regional level.

A very vocal Ms. Gregg remarked: "my cricketing career had been the happiest days of my life.", "The elation was evident every time I took the field and my teammates rallied around me." She gained selection on the West Indies Women's Cricket Team in 1989 and was permanently featured until 1997. Ms. Gregg was the first Saint Lucian to be selected on a West Indies Cricket Team.

"Greggos" as she is affectionately known (name coined by Former West Indies Coach Theo Cuffy) was one of the few female cricketers of that era, who was privileged to represent the West Indies in two World Cups, played in England and India in 1993 and 1997 respectively.

She made a significant contribution towards the development of cricket in Saint Lucia at both the youth and senior levels, working in close collaboration with the Ministry of Youth Development and Sports, the Sandals Foundation, the West Indies Cricket Board (now Cricket West Indies) and particularly the St. Lucia National Cricket Association (SLNCA), when she facilitated the practical component of the Sport for Life Programme in Saint Lucia.

In 2011, she was appointed Manager of the Sandals Academy Under 15 male camp which was held in Saint Lucia

She pursued a B.Sc. in Social Work at the University of the West Indies, (UWI) Cave Hill Campus and graduated with honours.

In 2017, Ms. Gregg received a telephone call from Cricket West Indies (CWI) requesting her services as Manager of the West Indies Women's Cricket team in a Home Series versus Sir Lanka. In that Home Series played in Trinidad and Antigua, the West Indies Women's team won both the T/20 and ODI matches convincingly. Thereafter, she managed the team on tour in New Zealand, South Africa home series which was played in Barbados and Antigua, followed by the 2018 stand-alone World T/20 in the West Indies and tours to Pakistan and Dabai in February, 2020.

Under the Skerritt and Dr. Shallow's administration, (2019 - 2021) Ms. Gregg was appointed member of the CWI Cricket Development Committee, an opportunity which she modestly embraced as a distinguished female amidst the many prominent male administrators who passionately discussed and worked tirelessly towards the holistic development of the game at all levels.

Ms. Gregg is a community activist, equally well-known for her commitment and involvement in community activities geared towards the development of her community. Professionally, Ms. Gregg worked as a Social Worker at the St. Lucia Crisis Centre Corporation and was later transferred to the Family Court in November 2013 where she continues to serve to date.

CHoF Inductee... Kamran Khan



Kamran Khan has been instructing cricket at Haverford, Pennsylvania, for nearly half a century, maintaining the College's historic tradition in the sport.

Since he became coach in 1974, Khan has helped the Fords' cricket fortunes flourish, with several successful tours, most notable among them being trips to England and Scotland in 1990, and an undefeated tour of England in 1996.

Meanwhile, he represented the United States in international competitions until 1990, earning All-World honors in 1978, and captained and co-captained the USA team from 1980-90. His latest tour came in the summer of 2019, when the Fords traveled to England following the conclusion of the academic year.

As a president of the USA Cricket Association in 2000-01, Khan developed, coordinated and promoted a wide spectrum of activities and projects for the betterment of cricket in America. He organized and conducted the U.S. team's tour to England in August 2001, and also coordinated fundraising and resource allocation for the International Cricket Council (ICC) competition in Toronto, in 2001.

Kamran Khan began to play cricket when he was four years old. Since then, cricket has become such an essential part of his life that he could not imagine himself being away from the sport. Anywhere he went or lived in the world, cricket was always with him. He represented Government College Lahore, Punjab (as captain) and Combined Universities.

He was awarded Pakistan's highest University Sports Award -- University Blue. Khan has a Master's degree in International Relations from Villanova University, Pennsylvania and first learned of Haverford cricket while visiting the College duck pond. He was soon urged to become the team's coach.

Besides his devotion to cricket, Kamran Khan has successfully developed and managed several personal businesses. He has been on the board of directors of the Bryn Mawr Business Association, Philadelphia, for many years and enjoys coaching the game he loves.

CHoF Inductee... Ashit Patel



Ashit Patel was born on 8th May, 1964, in Bombay, the cricket capital of India. Ashit became a lover of the sport when in January, 1975, the then mighty West Indies played the fifth and final test match under Clive Lloyd.

Clive Lloyd, the team captain, scored a glorious double century and although India lost the game, cricket gained a lifelong fan.

Ashit captained his school class team and opened the innings for his university team alongside Rajdeep Sardesai, the son of legendary Dilip Sardesai.

After University studies in India and America, Ashit entered the food and beverage industry, his first passion, but the universe had different plans.

In 2018, his best friend, business partner, and owner of the GT20 League, Gurmeet Singh Bhamra called him and asked him to run and manage the first season of GT20 in Canada.

Ashit always liked challenges and jumped straight into the opportunity to follow his first love, Cricket!

He set up the first international T20 League in North America in a country that did not have a stadium or infrastructure and needed a stadium or infrastructure to pull off a tournament of this magnitude.

In a short time-frame of 38 days, Ashit managed to build a temporary stadium with a 5,000- seat capacity, attracted over 50 international stars, including the likes of Smith, Warner, Gayle, Afridi, Pollard, Bravo and Russell, to name a few, and had the tournament beamed live to over 50 nations.

It was the first ICC-approved league for an associate member.

He had a dream at the beginning of the league to one day take the Canadian team back to the World Cup and make the North American region among the top 3 markets for cricket.

This year, Canada regained its status as an ODI nation, the first step towards achieving his dream...!

SPORTMEN'S ATHLETIC CLUB... A BRIEF HISTORY

The Sportmen's Athletic Club was organized in 1963, by a group of cricket enthusiasts who wanted to establish a second cricket club in the city of Hartford. The founding fathers which included Tommy Francis, Jethro Williams, Dudley Jones, Lloyd Scott, Samuel Webb (Creation), Oswald Williams, L. Collins, Joshua Guthrie and Nehemiah Wallace, gathered at a residence on Barbour Street and organized the club.

After its formation, the club quickly attracted an excellent caliber of cricket and soccer players. By the late sixties, Sportmen's became a formidable cricket team playing in the Northern Zone of the American Cricket League (ACL).

During the seventies and eighties, Sportmen's gave to Hartford, New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Toronto, Montreal (Canada), and Jamaica, a brand of cricket that helped to improve the standard of play throughout the continental North America (USA and Canada).

In 1976, through the leadership of then president Ed Patterson, the club was able to purchase the building at 2976 Main Street, Hartford, which has since been the headquarters for the organization.

In 1981, under the leadership of Michael Chambers, Sportmen's took on the very ambitious challenge to establish **the world's first Cricket Hall of Fame**, which has gained a great deal of respect throughout the city and the rest of the world. Located in the adjacent building on the premises, 3000 Main Street, the Hall of Fame is maintained through the generosity of the members of Sportmen's and a number of well-wishers.

The Induction ceremony is held on the first Saturday in October, each year, highlighting the outstanding individuals of the sport of cricket and their invaluable contribution to their communities and countries of origin.

ricket in the United States of America, as the Cricket Hall of Fame's Committee knows all too well, is a fragile sport and is dependent, to a large extent, on the excessive efforts of a few individuals.

The continued survival and success of the Staten Island Cricket Club, the oldest continuously active cricket club in the United States, could not have occurred without the contribution of Clarence Modeste.

Clarence was born in Tobago, where he was of course, exposed to cricket. Interestingly, it was not until he had finished with school that he began to play the game with any regularity, joining a club in Port of Spain, Trinidad, and developing into a medium pacer to be reckoned with.

After a spell in England, where he played cricket, squash and tennis at a club in Wimbledon, Clarence returned to his club in Port of Spain, in 1959. He eventually moved to New York City and joined some friends at Excelsior CC, in Brooklyn. In 1961, he began to play for Staten Island Cricket Club (SICC), and has remained there ever since.

This year (2023), he is celebrating 62 years at the club, where he is, it can be said without exaggeration, a legend. What particularly drew him to SICC, he says, was its exciting fixture list, which over the years came to encompass matches around the United States – among them Hartford, Boston, Fort Lauderdale, Washington, Baltimore and Philadelphia, and overseas tours to such places as; Canada, England, the Bahamas and Trinidad.

In due course, Clarence became heavily involved in the organization of these tours, and in the hosting of teams visiting from distant places, personally ensuring that the visitors received a fine impression of the New York cricket community, and providing them with tea. In this and other ways, Clarence's contribution has been far from limited to his own club, and his good reputation has spread beyond our small cricket world.

In recent years, Clarence has been the subject of respectful articles in, among other publications, the New York Times, the Daily Telegraph (UK), Caravan magazine (India), and the Adelaide Review (Australia).

"I would find it hard to believe that American cricket has known a finer or more valuable ambassador".

Clarence is currently President of SICC, an office that he has held for over 20 years, if not 30. Under his guidance, the club has been able to maintain its historic longevity and its association with its ground at Walker Park, which has been unbroken since 1886. The club has also maintained a vigorous fixture list of friendly matches, many of which, over the years, Clarence has captained and of course the SICC membership of the Metropolitan District and Cricket Association, which Clarence has served as Vice - President.

It bears mentioning that Clarence has continued to play cricket all this while, converting himself into an opening batsman.

His dedication to the common good is reflected in two other substantial ways. He was highly instrumental in the successful introduction of organized youth cricket to Staten Island CC in 2010. The club has now joined USYCA, and he continues, as a member of USACUA, to serve as an umpire. His interests in youth cricket and umpiring, have been combined, in recent years by umpiring at school matches in New York City.

Clarence has also been an active member of the British Officers' CC of Philadelphia. My difficulty, in making this nomination, is that it is almost impossible to extract from Clarence anything more than the barest information regarding his own achievements and activities.

Clarence Modeste is the essence of a man who puts the sport well ahead of himself and is most deserving of this august citation from the Cricket Hall of Fame..






